

3. Now you can draw how the Ichthyosaur might have looked when it was alive!










When he grew up, he joined the merchant navy and became an expert mariner.




He decided to plan an expedition: to cross Antarctica from sea to sea, via the South Pole. It would be the greatest journey ever attempted!





Mechanic – a person who fixes machinery
