Jurassic World dinosaurs in the following pages and fun-filled activities. You never know when you'll need to identify one!



Atrociraptors are tough hunters.




Panthera, Red, Ghost, and Tiger are four *Atrociraptors* that have been trained to track humans!







The small *Dilophosaurus* has a wide, colourful neck frill that she can open to scare her enemies away. She can also spit black venom with extreme accuracy.

with her herd.







The *Quetzalcoatlus* is one of the

in so many shapes and sizes.















Colour in the
Tyrannosaurus rex


